This is the course for you if you have the passion and desire to help and care for others!



The Health and Social care course is designed to help build knowledge and skills that are required to suit a broad range of health and social care careers as well as providing skills that can be utilised in a number of careers within wider society. The course combines a number of elements such as Sociology, English, Nutrition and Law to provide the stepping stones required to move onto a career either through University, apprenticeship or employment. The Health and Social Care course is a BTEC qualification, which means that the units are completed modularly throughout the two-year course.

Health & Social Care Course Units:

Single Award (1 A-Level)

- Human lifespan and Development (exam)
- Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs
- Working in Health and Social Care (exam)
- Physiological Disorders

Double (2 A-Levels) – plus all the single units

- Enquiries in current research (controlled assessment)
- Principles of safe working practice
- Promoting Public Health
- Nutritional Health

(All units are coursework unless stated)

What you need to get started:

You must have achieved at least a grade 4 in English and 4/P H&SC (if studied). You must also have a strong work ethic and be able to work independently to deadlines

Excellent attendance is essential and a willingness to learn is compulsory.
